It's the first time I actually prayed

In May, we received this from a student after a NET retreat. Countless young people tell NET teams they haven't prayed before their retreat; they often also express that they're not sure if they believe God is real.

These missionaries go out with a distinct mission in mind: to challenge young Catholics to love Christ and embrace the life of the Church. They give retreats almost on a daily basis, building personal relationships with the students and provide them with an opportunity to encounter our living God in prayer time. Prayer is central to a NET team. Their mission flows out of their personal prayer life; they frequently receive the sacraments and as a team they pray together daily.

Meet the Bentler family. A family creating counter-cultural traditions because they were impacted by young missionaries following God's will for their lives and serving as a NET missionary for a year.

Siblings Christianne (Team 2) and Matthew Bentler (Team 3) current NET missionaries, already recognise the prayer routine from the modelling of their parents. The Bentlers' parents, Kevin and Annette Bentler, are NET USA Alumni! Their parents both served as missionaries, in the early 1990s.

The formation that Kevin and Annette received has been handed down to their children, and they both agree that NET provides excellent formation for any current or future vocation. Together they incorporate many of the skills and practices that they learned in team life into their marriage and family life: "One of the most valued skills learned on NET and used daily in our family are conflict resolution and forgiveness. We learned to reach out to others and make them feel welcome. We learned to love the Mass, the Sacraments, and the Catholic Church."

All year, NET Canada missionaries learn how to have healthy relationships, how to manage conflict, how to love one another sacrificially and how to work as a team. The youth that will be interacting with the missionaries will see and hear them pray, and they will hear them share their life stories in a vulnerable way. Experiencing the joy of these young Catholic men and women has a huge effect on the youth. More young people's lives are going to change - because you actively support the NET Canada missionaries. Your support trains the missionaries in faith formation and gives them the tools to go out and share how Jesus has changed their lives.
