One of the most rewarding experiences I had this year was very simple, but it meant so much. We were facilitating a small retreat at a school on a reserve and it came to the prayer part of the day where we invite the youth to pray. I sat beside a young man as he struggled to pray. He was looking around, clearly distracted. I sat beside him and asked him if he knew how to pray, his response was "no". So I took the opportunity to get him to imitate the sign of the cross after me, and repeat the Our Father prayer after me. The result was an understanding of how to pray but also a change of heart. He sat there after we prayed and seriously took the opportunity to sit in silence and pray. He even started teaching his friends after prayer time how to do the sign of the cross. What I learnt that day was that everyone is at a different place in their life, but everyone can be impacted by God in simplest or greatest of ways.

Through persistent prayer, pilot teams, and the Lord's blessing, NET is sending a full-year team to Keewatin-Le Pas for the 2018-19 mission year. Thank you for helping to make this happen! Archbishop Murray Chatlain has been a long-time supporter of NET. He was instrumental in bringing NET to the Canadian North with teams going to Yellowknife and surrounding areas between 2010-2014 while he was bishop of Mackenzie-Fort Smith.

A Letter from the road...

Dearest sponsors,

Thank you so much for your continued support and prayers. My team and I are travelling coast to coast spreading the love of Jesus Christ to the youth of Canada. It has been a very busy, exciting, and enriching past few months!

When I first started NET training, I had an overwhelming feeling of not belonging. I could not find Bible scriptures as quickly as my NET peers could, and I couldn't keep up with the words in the songs as fast as they could. This left me feeling like I

would not be as effective a missionary as my peers. However, I soon learned that my story and my journey to Christ made me just as valuable a team member. My personal journey to Christ has touched the youth we have met so far, especially those who did not grow up in a Catholic home. I did not grow up in a Catholic family...so for youth to hear that same story inspires them to think "that sounds like me... there is hope for me, too!"

I would like to share one of these stories with you. While on a retreat, I met a boy who we'll name Jack. Jack had no interest in being on this retreat. It was mandatory for him to go as part of the class, so he came against his will. Jack was in my small group for the day. I soon learned that Jack, like me, wasn't raised in a Catholic home. He was quiet and withdrawn at the beginning of the retreat. It seemed like he wanted to leave. But then, I shared my personal testimony with the group. I noticed that lack became alert and engaged during my testimony. Afterwards, during our prayer portion of the day, Jack allowed me to pray with him. I placed my hand on his shoulder, and prayed for the Holy Spirit to be present in his life. After I finished praying, he shared with me that he felt something change in him. We chatted more about the faith, and he asked me if I could provide him with a couple Bible verses he could study, so he could come to know Jesus in a personal way. I was so excited for Jack that I gave him one of our NET Bibles to keep. He smiled ear to ear.

Being on a travelling team, I don't have the privilege of follow up with him. I plant the seed, go on my way to the next town, and trust Jesus to water the seed. I pray for Jack regularly, and hope he has kept up with reading the Bible I gave to him. Please pray for him and his journey as he comes to know Jesus!

This ministry is not only impacting those I meet on the road. Listen to this: it has impacted my own mother. She was baptized Catholic as a child, and is only now being prepared for Confirmation. She found her way back to the faith, all because I followed the call to serve a year as a missionary. How amazing! Please pray for her, too!

So many wonderful things are going on during this journey with NET. I know I belong to this mission. I look forward to continuing this year and seeing what God has in store for my team and me! I ask for your continued prayers.




