

Bringing Faith to Northern Canada

"I feel very empty", a young man told Mike Hartman, a member of the Keewatin-Le Pas NET team during his lunch break. Mike's team was visiting his high school and he was bursting with questions for the team.

Mike sat with the young man, shared his testimony and how he came to be doing ministry there. That evening, the young man attended a youth event that Mike had invited him to.

"This guy approached me *right away* because I had chatted with him at the high school.

He desired prayer for God to transform the emptiness in his life into joy. We prayed with him. At the end of the prayer he said, 'I don't feel sad anymore.' He expressed to us that he felt filled." Praise God!

It really takes an open mind to be present with the people and to show compassion. There are still many wounds that people carry, even against the church, and especially with residential schools. Sometimes all you can do is listen to their story and hear about the ways that they've been wounded and invite them to bring that to the Lord. The members of Team 4 have discovered how ready God is to heal and set people free; they simply need to be bold and ask.

This is just one of the *many* instances where Mike has witnessed God moving in the North.

On his second NET year, Mike had been on a team that worked out of Yellowknife, NT, and looking back, he said "I really, really enjoyed myself... I really enjoyed the culture, the indigenous people."

When asked if he felt called to this new specific mission, Mike responded "Definitely."

'In the Northwest Territories, the majority of the population is in Yellowknife itself. Whereas, in Keewatin-Le Pas, there's not really any big population centre—all the communities are very spread out."

This year, Mike and his team of six missionaries (called "Team 4"), have travelled across the vast diocese of Keewatin-Le Pas which covers a land mass of 430,000 square kilometres in northern Saskatchewan, Manitoba and a small corner of northwest Ontario.

Mike is different from the 60 other missionaries with NET Canada this year. This is his third year of mission with NET. Mike served with NET (2013/14 and 2014/15), then worked as a mechanical designer and engineer for three years. This is when he was presented with the idea of serving for a third year. NET wanted experienced missionaries to serve in the diocese of Keewatin-Le Pas for this special mission, and Mike was the ideal candidate.

Geographical isolation is their greatest obstacle in ministry. They've discovered that the people who they minister to, these "people of the North", desperately desire to be loved, to belong, to be a community, and to be heard.

The response to the team's presence has been truly positive.

"People in the communities have a big heart for the youth because they see the struggles that they're going through. There's not a lot of help for them, so our presence is really encouraging and empowering for them to see."

God has been preparing the hearts of the people of Keewatin-Le Pas and creating fertile soil for the Gospel. After only one year of ministry in this diocese, there has been so much fruit. Thanks to your prayers and support, Team 4 is able to spread the Good News and plant the seeds of evangelization and hope! We look forward to what God has in store for this diocese in the coming year.

I'd love to see more faithful teachers in the Catholic education system. Lastly, I am discerning the priesthood.
