He truly gives a hundredfold of what you think you're giving and you're going to come out so different and so much better, and you'll never have an opportunity like this. So don't waste it.

What are some of the biggest ways that you grew? Either things that you learned or ways that you saw vourself grow?

I think ways that I've grown, definitely trust in the Lord. There's lots of uncertainties, on NET and for me in the future. And sometimes I just gotta let go and be like, I've got no idea what's going on. It's just so great. You know, like not having to stress about every little thing. I was like, it was meant to be, it's going to happen. And sometimes it doesn't work like that, but it's just this freeing feeling, like it's like a weight lifted off your shoulders just to just have more trust in God.

What would you tell someone who's considering doing NET, but isn't sure if it's something they should do?

Just jump in. I was so unsure of doing it this year, but sometimes you've got to say, "fine, God, I'll just go". There will be growth, and there are lots of things that you'll find that you just wouldn't expect to find. I had no idea I was going to find community. I didn't realize I was lacking community and I didn't realize I had this deep longing for community and that's what I found.

Tell me about your year. What did ministry look like?


